MINUTES of Executive Committee (EC) Meeting Water Resources Association of Yolo County April 4, 2016, 12:00 - 1:00 pm

Present: Bill Marble, Cecilia Curry Tim O'Halloran, Kristin Sicke, Kurt Balasek and Donna Gentile

Absent: Elisa Sabatini

1. Call to Order: Meeting was called to order by Bill Marble at 12:00 pm.

- **2. Approve Agenda and Adding Items to the Posted Agenda:** 2016 Draft Request for Proposals DAC Involvement comment letter added to agenda (at request of Elisa). Agenda approved with this addition.
- **3. Public Comment:** No public in attendance.

4. Administrative Items:

- a) March 7, 2016 EC minutes were approved.
- b) Review Financials FY2015-16: The EC reviewed the March 2016 financials.
- c) Discuss draft FY2016-17 budget with project fund recommendations: Donna will start drafting a FY16-17 budget for review at the next EC meeting. Expenses should be similar to this year without the audit expense. There will be approximately \$98,000 available for the Project Budget and the TC will discuss the project budget request process in April, May and June. Donna mentioned that at some point the WRA website will need to be updated with a more user-friendly template. The template restricts the amount of usable space (~50%) on screen and limits the amount of information that can be posted and legible. The website was last updated in 2005/2006 for the IRWMP process. The EC suggested waiting for the GSA formation and tie-in any updates to the website at that time. Donna will start gathering research on costs and options for a website upgrade from our web designer.
- d) 2016 Draft Request for Proposals DAC Involvement comment letter: A draft comment letter from the WRA has been presented by Elisa and Jacques DeBra for EC consideration. The deadline is this Friday, April 8th. Donna explained that Elisa and Jeanette Wrysinski have presented this to the Westside Coordinating Committee chair and a response has not been received. It would be OK for the WRA to also submit a comment letter on the draft PSP language. Kristin thought it would be stronger to have the letter come from the Westside. The grant funding would need to come through the Westside as it has done previously for Prop 84. Donna will inquire about the status of the Westside's letter with Jeanette and Elisa. Yolo County is also sending a comment letter to DWR. The EC approved submitting a letter from the WRA.
- e) Payments to approve All payments were approved

5. Update on Water Legislation & Regulatory Issues

Tim reported on Senator Wolk's groundwater legislation and Assemblyman Dodd's water data legislation at the last EC meeting. There isn't any additional information to report. Tim was invited to attend a meeting with Lester Snow (through Dodd's office) on data management this week.

6. SGMA Planning & Implementation

a) Facilitation Process Update: Tim gave his summary of the SGMA public meetings held in Woodland, Winters and Clarksburg at the end of March. Attendance and participation was greater than expected. Overall the meetings went very smoothly, including healthy controversy and discussion from the attendees. Many questions and concerns were addressed at each meeting. The Yolo County Farm Bureau did an excellent job of handling all the logistics. Tim proposed that the WRA split the costs of the meeting expenses that the Farm Bureau incurred. The EC approved the WRA splitting the costs 50/50 with the Farm Bureau.

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b) Other SGMA related activities: Tim discussed events leading up to the three SGMA public workshops held in March. Tim met with landowners and agencies in the Capay Valley and the Clarksburg areas to discuss the proposed Basin Boundary Modifications (BBM) for submission to DWR. He summarized his discussions with both groups. It appears the Clarksburg area has decided to align with the Delta GSA formation process, whose groundwater sustainability issues and concerns are more similar than with the rest of the Yolo County basin. A BBM was submitted to DWR on March 31st for the Yolo subbasin along with resolutions of support from several WRA member agencies.

Tim and the Steering Committee will now shift their focus to the GSA formation process. The EC discussed some possible scenarios of the GSA's structure and its relationship to the WRA's current role and responsibilities. Bill suggested the Steering Committee may want to discuss how to bring the City Manager's Working Group into the JPA formation discussion for their input and ideas.

7. Technical Committee (TC) & Westside IRWMP Update: The TC will start the FY16-17 project budget discussions. The TC may want to consider reserving funding for more SGMA activities.
